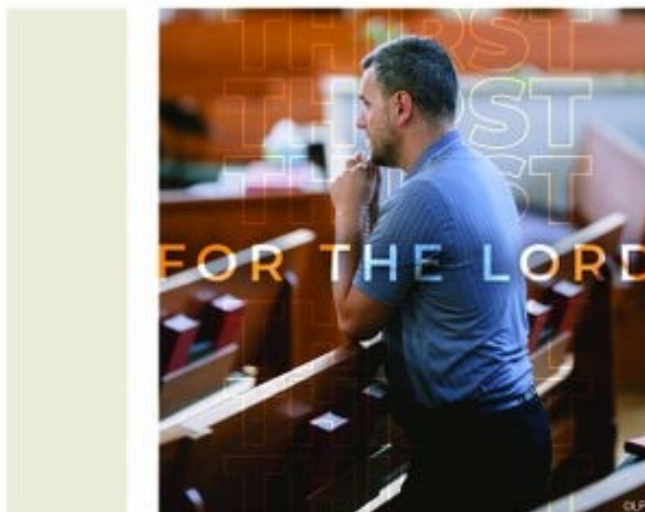

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Recently I received a note from a teenager I met years ago. He wrote, "Dear Father Muir, you probably do not remember me, but I wanted to thank you for your inspiring and humorous homilies at the parish. They helped me appreciate the beauty of Catholicism, which I have now embraced in a personal way." That small note moved me more than he probably imagined. I had no idea my words had taken root in him. I was simply sowing seeds — week by week, Mass by Mass. Someone else — his parents, a youth minister, or God Himself — was doing the deeper work. Now this young man is joyfully reaping a harvest of faith.

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers living water to a Samaritan woman whose life had been full of searching and disappointment. By the end of their encounter, she becomes a bold and joyful evangelist. Then Jesus turns to his disciples and says something easily overlooked: **"One sows and another reaps" (John 4:37)**. He is helping them — and us — understand how evangelization works. Often, the one who sows the seeds of faith is not the one who sees the fruit.

This Lent, ask yourself: Are you in a sowing phase or a reaping phase? If you are sowing — raising children, praying for someone, mentoring — be patient. Your work matters. If you are reaping — seeing someone come alive in faith — be grateful. You are standing on sacred ground, tilled and watered by others.

Lenten challenge: Thank someone who once sowed faith into your life. And keep sowing, even when the harvest is unseen.

Archbishop Wester Would Like Your Feedback!

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe is conducting a comprehensive planning study now through the end of March. After months of prayer and discussion, Archbishop John C. Wester, along with archdiocesan and lay leaders, have identified several extraordinary opportunities and needs that go beyond the day-to-day. Needs that will help to fulfill our mission to “Rebuild our Church.”

For this reason, the archdiocese is considering a capital campaign to address these priorities. But we need your help, your voice and your gifts. The decisions we make now and the steps we take can help the Catholic Church flourish in central and northern New Mexico – not just for today, but for generations to come.

Archbishop Wester is asking every Catholic family within the archdiocese to share their thoughts regarding our needs and proposed funding priorities, including:

- Local Parish Needs (50% of funds raised stay in the parish)
- Forming and Sustaining Lifelong Vocations
- Strengthening Catholic Schools
- Enhancing Archdiocesan Ministries and Services in Support of Parishes

Your feedback will help us refine these goals and priorities and determine the potential level of support within our community. If together we choose to move forward, the planning study will also provide us with information to identify prospective campaign leaders and establish a realistic campaign goal. The Steier Group, a national Catholic development firm, is conducting the study on our behalf. The findings of the study, including the viability of a campaign, will be presented to us later this April. At that time, Archbishop Wester will make an informed decision regarding how best to move forward.
