





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, "Racism is today's great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it." I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don't we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus' words this week help. He says, "Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in—what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.

Union de Los Santos Sunday July 6, 2025

In preparation for the Bernalillo fiestas de San Lorenzo, the community comes together to celebrate

La Union de Los Santos (The Union of the Saints) & La Procesion de la Comunidad (Community Procession)

This day commemorates the coming together of the three images of San Lorenzo
(the patron saint of Bernalillo). The celebration has been taking place for generations as a symbol of unity
between Bernalillo, the Catholic Church, and the neighboring community of El Llanito. The first of two
processions will start from Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church (Santuario de San Lorenzo) at 6:15 p.m.
This procession will lead the Santo Bulto south through the Town Bernalillo. The second procession will start from the
Mayordomos residence (Martinez/Carabajal . 1150 Calle San Lorenzo) at 6:45 p.m. The Matachines will
lead the second procession to unite the Santo de la Plaza (Santa Estampa) with the second image which is the Santo
Viejo. Once both images are joined, both processions will unite and bring all three images of San Lorenzo together.
This will begin the preparation for the Fiesta de San Lorenzo that takes place on August 9th-11th

LA HISTORIA

EL SANTO DE LA PLAZA EL SANTO DE LA ESTAMPA

This image of San Lorenzo was introduced some time in the early to mid 1900s and is housed at the home of the Mayordomos throughout the year. This image is known as the "saint of the people" and is also called the saint of Las Cocinitas, which was the original location of Bemalillo after resettlement in 1693.

Bernalillo in Los Gallegos, today known as El Llanito. After the flood of 1735 the Silva family became the first caretakers of this image of San Lorenzo, plus other church artifacts. In the mid-1900s Miguel Montoya and his family became the new caretakers of this old Santo. Today the Lovato family continues to carry on the legacy of their father and grandfather as the current caretakers of the Santo Viejo. This image is returned to the Lovato family on September 11th, after the September 10th rosary in honor of San Lorenzo, and one month after the fiestas.

EL SANTO VIEJO DE SAN LORENZO

Silva, Montoya/Lovato Family, 1693-1735 This is the oldest of the images of San

Lorenzo in Bernalillo. It is privately owned and is loaned to the people of Bernalillo during the fiestas. This has been a tradition for as long as anyone can remember. It is known that there was a time when the Santo Viejo (Silva) was transported by horse and buggy from El Llanito to an area near the old Sandoval County Court House (La Union de Los Santos). At which point, the fiesta season would begin and much preparation would ensue. It is rumored that this saint was brought from Spain via Mexico in the late 1600s by Don Diego

DeVargas. It is said that the Silva family were the Mayordomos of an old chapel located just north of

EL SANTO BULTO DE SAN LORENZO

Santuario de San Lorenzo 1993

This is the newest image of San Lorenzo in Bernalillo and was introduced in 1993 and is housed in the Santuario de San Lorenzo at Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church throughout the year. It was hand-carved and donated to the church by the late Filimon Aguilar (a local santero). This image has helped unite the community and the church by linking local traditions with the Catholic faith. Just like the Santo Viejo, the Santo Bulto is returned to its home in the Santuario de San Lorenzo on September 11th, after the September 10th rosary in honor of San Lorenzo, and one month after the fiestas.
